

Background checks: If you do not have a current background check on file you will have received notice over email to complete one. Need help? The camp welcome & information table is located near the main entrance.

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If you have completed a background check within the last three years for La Semana, you do not need to renew one for this year.

Covid Protocols: There has been a recent surge of cases within the area. We encourage mask wearing when indoors for the benefit of our immunocompromised campers and families. If you or your camper feels sick we ask that you stay home.

What to Bring: Wear comfortable closed-toe athletic shoes, warm-weather clothes, sunscreen, a refillable water bottle and bug spray.

We will have a brief informational Zoom meeting on Monday July 25 at 7:00pm to go over camp expectations and the logistics of how Ayudantes will help out at camp this year. This meeting is mandatory! A meet and greet will be held Tuesday July 26 prior to check in from 3:00pm-4:00pm at Basecamp. Come spend time with your fellow ayudantes and alumnos!

Alumnos: We are looking forward to having you back at camp this year! If you are a first-year alumni we ask you to also attend the mandatory Zoom meeting on Monday July 25 at 7:00pm as well as the meet and greet Tuesday July 26 at 3:00pm before check in.

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Tuesday Welcome Dinner: We will kick off the start of La Semana with check in for all volunteers and campers from 4:00-5:00pm at Basecamp followed by the Flag Ceremony at 5:00pm. Dinner will be served at 6:30pm.

To our La Semana friends and families who could not join us this year at camp, we invite you to join us for our welcome dinner! If you are not registered to attend or volunteer at camp this year, any good will donation per person is encouraged and greatly appreciated.

There will also be items for purchase from the camp store and common hope marketplace. The camp store will accept card only and common hope with accept cash and card.

Fiesta Friday Celebration: We will wrap up our week with our Fiesta Friday celebration! This will include a variety of fun activities for our campers throughout the camp day from 9:00am to 1:00pm when checkout will take place.

This is the official end to the camp day, however, we then invite all campers, families, volunteers, and guests to attend our end of camp party. We will have a DJ, performance from Corazon Latino, and more! We will **not** serve lunch this day, so we ask all campers to bring their own lunch to camp. We will provide snacks to compensate for the late lunch hour.

Lunch: This year we will offer all campers and volunteers lunch from El Burrito Mercado. Hot lunch will be available onsite Wednesday and Thursday of camp. Wednesday's meal will include pork tamales, rice, and beans. Thursday's will include chicken enchiladas with salsa verde, rice, and beans. Lunch will be free of charge however we encourage and appreciate any donations during lunch.

Service Project: This year campers will be building supply bags out of t-shirts for The Bridge for Youth out of Minneapolis. Bring at least 1 t-shirt to craft with (no holes, no profanity) and if you want, supplies to donate:

- Basic clothing/undergarments (t-shirts, men's boxers, women's underwear, socks, sweatpants,)
- Summer items (sunscreen, sunglasses, umbrellas)
- Hygiene items (toothbrushes, toothpaste, deodorant, hand sanitizer, bring your hotel provided items!)

We will have bins out all week for supply and t-shirt donations.

Additionally, campers will work with Common Hope to learn about and raise money for education in Guatemala by participating in a Walk for Hope. We will have a webpage setup for information and donations as well as a donation collection at Basecamp.

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Drop Off/Pick Up:

- Do NOT arrive BEFORE 8:20 am Wednesday-Friday unless you have permission from your volunteer area chair or the camp chair.
- All campers, volunteers and visitors must enter through the main door.
- All campers must check out with their chaperone when leaving camp. If leaving early, a parent must notify a camp official in advance.

Chaperones CANNOT allow a child to leave without an authorized adult. Let your group chaperone know if anyone other than a parent is allowed to pick up your child.

Behavior Expectations for All:

- All campers, parents and volunteers must follow the rules outlined in the Code of Conduct (Link to 'Code of Conduct' provided below)
- Ayudantes who are having difficulty fulfilling their assignments will be talked with and a
 parent/guardian will be contacted. (Please refer to Ayudante Discipline under the Ayudante section
 of the website for further info)
- Please respect all campers and presenters. You may not post any photos containing images of MINOR campers or Ayudantes without PARENTAL permission.

Visitors:

- Visitors are more than welcome during our social events on **Tuesday evening** during our welcome dinner or on **Friday afternoon** during our fiesta events.
- Upon arrival, visitors must check in at the camp welcome & information table and wear a nametag throughout the day. Visitors under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult at all times.

Emergencies: In the event of an emergency, call 612-208-PLAC (7522) or 911 for medical emergency.

Information for Volunteers: Name tags must be worn all week. All volunteers, check-in and pick up your name tag on Tuesday at the volunteer check in table BEFORE going to your assigned volunteer position. Please return your name tag at the end of camp on Friday.

The volunteer table can assist you with any questions about your assignment. Volunteers should check-in at their volunteer spot before the opening ceremony on Tuesday.

DO NOT ARRIVE BEFORE 8:20 on Wednesday-Friday unless you have been instructed to by your chair. Please supervise your children before you check them into their group at 9am. It is very difficult to change positions. For the brief week of camp, we encourage all volunteers to remain in the position for which they have been assigned (and agreed to). Please refrain from any position changes unless it's absolutely critical.

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We are counting on your pledge to volunteer in this role. If you do not fulfill your volunteer role at camp you will need to be charged the full price of camp. Every position is important for the camp to be successful for you and your child(ren). The more attention we give the children during this week at camp, the more enriched their experience - and yours - will be. Schedules and group assignments: This year we will not be posting schedules and group assignments prior to camp. In order to maintain the safety and privacy of our campers and volunteers, these schedules and assignments will be distributed to campers and volunteers during check in. We appreciate your patience and understanding.

Photo Opportunities: Although we will not be able to have a yearbook this year, there will be plenty of opportunities for photos. Please remember, any photograph taken of campers or Ayudantes requires parental permission before taking the photo and especially posting.
